

FACT SHEET

Punctuation is made up of little marks that help make sense of a string of words.

Here are the first four marks you must learn:

- The comma, comes in the middle of a sentence. It has several jobs. One of them is to separate clauses.
- The full stop comes at the end of a sentence. It has just one job, to complete or terminate a sentence.

Two other marks also come at the end of a sentence.

- ! The exclamation mark makes the words sound loud and shouty.
- ? The question mark makes words sound doubtful and questioning.

Now we'll explain the punctuation changes we made in the story.

Red Hoodie is going to visit Granny. In her bag, Red Hoodie has a cake, cookies and candy.

The full stop needs to end the sentence after 'Granny.' Then a new sentence starts 'In her bag...'

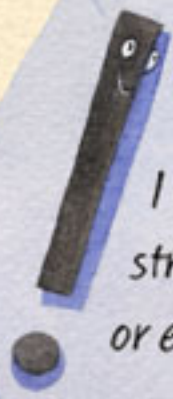
